



Birdwatching

Twitch is an avid birdwatcher. He plans to spend his summer holidays at Aves Wood Nature Reserve in his secret birdwatching hide.

You could become a bird watcher just like Twitch.

You could visit a local nature reserve or go to the park, but you don't have to go anywhere special to find birds.

Sit in your garden or on your balcony or look out of your bedroom window and see what you can see.

Look round on your way to school or on a walk to the shops.

You might even find them on the school playground.

Record all the birds that you see. You may see some pigeons, or sparrows, a blackbird or a robin, or maybe something more unusual such as a red kite.

You could make a list or draw all the birds that you see or even take photographs.

If you want to attract more birds to your garden or balcony you could set up a small bird feeder with some bird seed, peanuts or food balls. Different foods will attract different birds to your home.
